




- March 2010

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Twitter




- 3-21-2006

- China has the greatest number of users




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How often do you access your Favorite Social Media/Chat Application? (Per Day)


- 73% of US teens have a smartphone

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How Do Students Use Technology to Research?

- According to the Pew Report, students view research as “Googling”



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- Google or other online search engine (94%)
- Wikipedia or other online encyclopedia (75%)
- YouTube or other social media sites (52%)
- Their peers (42%)
- Spark Notes, Cliff Notes, or other study guides (41%)
- News sites of major news organizations (25%)
- Print or electronic textbooks (18%)
- Online databases such as EBSCO, JSTOR, or Grolier (17%)
- A research librarian at their school or public library (16%)
- Printed books other than textbooks (12%)
- Student-oriented search engines such as Sweet Search (10%)



- Use the embed code to link to teacher website



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
