To create an account:

Go to www.readtheory.org.

Click on **Sign up** to create your account.

Creating classes:

Next click on the PLUS sign  to create a class. You can have multiple classes.

To add students- Click on the .

Add each student's name. I made an easy class code. abcd1234 (Easy for everyone to remember.)

Once everyone is added, you can pass out their login info using the **Student Account Handout**. This link is found on your roster page. You can also print a roster of each student's username, etc... *I keep this handy in my classroom for children to use if they forget their information or lose their account handout.*

Taking Quizzes:

Students will begin with a pretest to determine Lexile level, then they immediately begin reading passages and taking quizzes. They can move back and forth between the passage and the questions to find textual evidence.

Analysing Data and Progress Results:

Use these codes to look at a child's progress with them.




My Progress- Graphs a child's progress as he/she moves up and down Lexile levels. (If the child scores below a certain percentage, their Lexile level will be lowered. A 90% or above will raise their level.)



Quiz History- You can look at the student's history. Click on a quiz. Go over the quiz with the student.
